


Standing on the "magic spot" in the Legislature to listen to the acoustics.

Alberta Education Assurance Survey

Information for parents and guardians

About the survey

Every year, Alberta Education surveys students, their parents and all teachers on behalf of schools and school authorities to assess what is working well and where there is room for improvement. The survey asks students in grades 4, 7 and 10, and their parents, about their thoughts, feelings and experiences in school. The survey will be administered between January and March 2024. In some schools, all students in grades 4 and above and their parents will be s u r veye d.

Participants will be asked questions on a variety of topics, such as welcoming, caring, respectful and safe learning environments; student learning engagement; and parental involvement. The survey does not ask for names and cannot be used to identify individual participants.



Why is the survey needed?

Alberta's Assurance Framework requires school authorities across the province to report their performance according to a number of different measures that provide key information about how the education system is doing. A provincial survey allows all school authorities to be measured on the same things at the same time.

Participation in the survey is voluntary:

- All participants may opt out of taking the survey at any time with no repercussions and/or skip any questions they do not wish to answer.
- All responses are anonymous. The survey does not collect personally identifiable information and Random Access Codes will be used to group responses by survey type, school and authority.
- Only grouped data where there are more than six responses are reported.
- All data collected will be managed in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.
- If you have any questions regarding the survey or your child's participation, please contact your child's school directly.





How will I take the survey?

- Parents or guardians are issued a single-use Random Access Code mailed through Canada Post to complete the survey online.
- The code must be used to access the survey and helps Alberta Education group your response as being from a parent/guardian. It is not used to identify individuals.
- Monitor your Canada Post mailbox starting late-January 2024 for the survey invitation package from Alberta Education.
- Parents or guardians with more than one student in an eligible grade will receive a separate survey invitation package for each child.
- Paper copies of the survey can also be requested through your school principal once the survey opens.



How will students take the survey?

- Students complete the survey at school.
- Before the survey begins, your child's teacher or school staff will explain to the students that the survey is not a test – there are no right or wrong answers. They will also explain that there are no repercussions for opting out of participating and that they may skip questions they do not wish to answer.
- Responses are submitted anonymously. Random Access Codes will be used to group responses by survey type, grade, school and school authority only.

Supporting Your Child's Needs

Raising children can be the most rewarding and most difficult aspect of your life. Making sure children understand and follow simple rules, teaching social skills, dealing with frustrations, and encouraging independence are just a few of the ways parents are expected to help their children. Being a good role model and having open lines of communication are vital in effective parenting. By discussing experiences and feelings, describing why family decisions are made, and listening to both sides of family disagreements, you can help your children adjust to the structures and demands of parenting. Here are some other ways to help yourself with parenting.

Support your child's physical needs.

Safety, shelter, good nutrition, sleep, exercise, and medical care are important physical needs of children. Using seat belts, teaching home safety rules, and "kid-proofing" your house help you meet your child's needs for a safe environment. Keeping a comfortable home as well as being concerned about clothing and the weather are part of meeting shelter needs. Encouraging your children to eat three good meals a day that incorporate the four food groups is part of meeting their nutritional needs. A good night's rest and daily exercise are also important in supporting good physical health. Take your children for regular visits to their physician to monitor health and obtain advice on ways to support their growth and development.

Support your child's emotional needs.

Love, acceptance, security, and praise are important emotional needs of children. Let your children feel your love by how you hold, touch, and smile at them. Telling your children of your love is good, but showing is better. Accept your children's accomplishments and try not to dwell on failures. Avoid using threats to security to control your child. Be positive when making decisions about discipline; look for opportunities to praise rather than punish. Kind words and gestures go a long way in helping to support your children's emotional needs. When praising children, focus on their ability and effort as sources for positive performance. Look for opportunities to say something positive to children each day and help them practice making positive comments about others.

Support your child's intellectual needs.

Talk to your children about what is going on in your world. Try not to burden them with problems, but do not be afraid to share positive and negative aspects of your work and social life. Encourage your children to ask questions and be sure to provide honest answers; ask for help when tough questions come up. Become involved in your children's school; ask teachers to describe what is being taught and how you can provide support at home. If you do not understand a homework assignment, ask for help. Look for opportunities to support school assignments with family trips and outside activities. Encourage your children to be creative at home and point out opportunities to share creative experiences back at school. Ask your children's teachers to supply a list of learning aids (e.g., calculators, globes, resource and reference materials) that you can use to assist them with school assignments at home.

By supporting your children's physical, emotional, and intellectual needs, you can help yourself make parenting a more positive experience.

- •After your one week rental, return the LRC Family Pass back to the office for other families to enjoy.





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


